Bus Discipline Procedures and Consequences

Riding the bus is a privilege. This privilege may be temporarily denied or permanently revoked if a child's misconduct jeopardizes the safe operation of the school bus or the safety of students riding the bus.

The code below classifies unacceptable behavior into four levels.

Consequences for repeat infractions related to transportation include, but are not limited to:
